IMPORTANT VOTING INFORMATION

The 2010 Elections will offer voters three choices in voting in Summit County.

1. In person at a polling place on Election Day
2. In person at an early voting site
3. By mail via Mail-In(Absentee) ballot

Summit County has implemented "Vote Centers." There will be 5 Vote Centers located around Summit County. Vote Centers are designed to provide voters with maximum flexibility and convenience on Election Day while complying with election laws. Voters will be able to go to any Vote Center in the county to cast their ballots. Precinct specific polling places will not be used. At the Vote Center, you will be required to show valid ID, such as a driver's license.

You will also have the option of casting your vote prior to Election Day at one of the early voting sites (the Old Courthouse, 208 E. Lincoln, Breckenridge or the Buffalo Mountain Room, County Commons, 37 County Road 1005., Frisco) The early voting sites for the Primary Election will be open from Monday, August 2 through Friday, August 6 during normal business hours. Early Voting for the General Election will be open from Monday, October 4 through Friday, October 29. You may find this more convenient and less time consuming than waiting in line at a Vote Center on Election Day.

If you prefer, you may vote by mail via Mail-In(Absentee) ballot. Mail-In(Absentee) ballots may be requested by completing and returning the Mail-In(Absentee) ballot application (available to download at www.co.summit.co.us). You may also call the Election Office at (970)453-3479 and an application will be mailed to you. Completed applications should be mailed to: Summit County Elections, P.O. Box 1538, Breckenridge, CO 80424 or faxed to 970-453-3540, or emailed to lynnb@co.summit.co.us. To receive your Mail-In(Absentee) ballot by mail, we must receive your request by Tuesday, August 3, 2010 for Primary Election and October 26, 2010 for the General Election. We will begin mailing absentee ballots out during the first week of October. The ballots are due back in the elections office by 7:00 p.m. on Election Day, Tuesday August 10, for the Primary Election, Tuesday, November 2, 2010 for the General Election.
